Dear Mr. Pederson:


The City of Los Angeles is a community of interest with all local government services organized and delivered in the same manner citywide. It is already broken up into five supervisorial districts and should not be broke up anymore. Please consider the following:

- The 3rd District unites three adjacent interlocking communities of interest – the greater Westside, San Fernando Valley and the Las Virgenes region. This area is cohesive and compact, topographically, geographically and culturally.
- County services are often organized and delivered according to our boundaries.
- The Westside cities participate in a Council of Government (COG) to address transportation, planning and homelessness issues.
- The Santa Monica Mountains form another community of interest because of environmental issues related to its topography such as hillside planning and development, water runoff and emergency preparedness. These mountains define the 3rd District that binds the Westside, San Fernando Valley and Las Virgenes areas together.
- It is extremely important to ensure that our entire region remains as a district to deal with issues of the Los Angeles River and the north Santa Monica Bay, transit services, affordable housing, environmental and recreational resources and art and cultural resources.

Our Comstock Hills community represents 300 single family homes in Westwood. We

strongly urges the retention of the 3rd Supervisorial District boundaries so as to preserve the ongoing leadership that understands and works to achieve the best that LA County can attain.
