Dear Supervisor Knabe,

The coastal cities of Los Angeles County occupy a long stretch of geography and deserve to remain divided into two districts on the County Board of Supervisors for the most effective representation of their diverse interests.

As a long-time lessee and business owner in Marina del Rey, I have come to recognize the value and importance of the successful representation of unincorporated Marina del Rey by the Fourth District over the years.

Presently, Marina del Rey is included with other South Bay cities, as well as San Pedro and Long Beach, in the Fourth District. These communities share common coastal community interests, particularly because marinas, recreational boating and marine-related businesses are found almost exclusively within these Fourth District communities.

On the other hand, coastal cities to the north up to the Ventura County line, including Venice, Santa Monica and Malibu, don't have marinas and marine-related businesses. These northern coastal cities also share a commonality of interests with the Westside of Los Angeles and the Santa Monica Mountains. These communities should remain in the Third District, which has effectively represented them for the past two decades.

I believe that it is vitally important that our coastal communities should continue to retain their existing representation on the Board of Supervisors. Marina del Rey has always been a part of the Fourth District and should remain that way for the next decade under the new reapportionment plan.

In adopting the recommended Plan A-2, the Boundary Review Committee recognized that the existing representation of our coastal communities should continue with little change, other than to account for any population shifts.

Thank you for your consideration of these issues during your deliberations.

I earlier emailed your staff strongly urging that any redistricting within Los Angeles County be done in a manner that would minimize the displacement of citizens from their current districts. I was specifically addressing some concerns about District 4, where some of the options would have resulted in extremely unnecessary and illogical boundary changes.

It simply does not make sense to do anything more than minimal minor "tweaking" to meet the mandate of near equal representation. A major objective must be to keep the various staff personnel now functioning in District 4 in areas where they know the needs of, and can best service, their people.

I now see that two options may be offered for consideration. It seems very obvious that one option (A-2) better satisfies the mandate with very minimal dislocation from the current boundaries. The other option (S-1) very obviously violates the premise of minimal impact, resulting in extreme dislocation from the current status.

I find it beyond belief that S-1 would even be considered, given the apparent ability of A-2 to accomplish what has to be done.

I respectfully urge you to see what seems so obvious, that S-1 is clearly an unacceptable option.
