


It is my belief that communities with shared interests and services should also have shared representation. The current boundaries do not support this notion.





To Whom it May Concern,

During the last 10 years, I have seen the unincorporated area of Monrovia-Arcadia-Duarte (MAD) change for the better. The leadership demonstrated by Supervisor Michael Antonovich has been equally unbiased, and fairly distributed among the people that he represents. In my personal experience, living in a community that is predominantly populated by minorities such as Latinos and African-Americans, I have seen his representation through his field chief, Brian Mejia, who makes sure that our voice and needs are heard, evaluated and met by our supervisor. Our community has seen the construction of a new gym, a skating area, and a modern playground for children and youth at Pamela Park. Equally important, we have been served and protected by the Sheriff Department, who also operates under Supervisor Antonovich's leadership. Dear Redistricting Commission Members:

Let me start off by thanking you for taking into account our comments regarding the Senate District identified as LAPRW on your map. Your visualizations prepared for the July 8 meeting demonstrate that you listened to us and our concerns regarding representation for our communities and having the entire district in Los Angeles County.

I would like to request one further amendment however. The City of Montebello seems to more properly belong in the district directly north of LAPRW. I have always thought of Montebello as part of the San Gabriel Valley rather than the Gateway Cities or Southeast cities. Montebello is a part of the San Gabriel Valley Council of Governments. If you search the term San Gabriel Valley, Montebello will show up as a part of the definition or listing of cities.

I rarely go to Montebello for entertainment, to shop, to dine or for recreational opportunities. I consider Lynwood, South Gate and Huntington Park to be much more similar to my communities and the other communities depicted in the visualization on your website. The Chinese American Citizens Alliance Proposed 27th Senatorial Districts Alternative Plan/Map also makes this distinction. I believe the proposed Alternative Plan/Map for the 27th District prepared by the Chinese American Citizens Alliance does a better job in grouping our cities based on the similarities of our communities and geography.

Again, I appreciate your responsiveness to our concerns and comments and am pleased that the California Citizens Redistricting Commission has done what the voters who passed the Voters First Act asked for. You listened to Californians. Thank you.

Rowland Heights, Hacienda Heights, Diamond Bar and Walnut are ethnically similar communities with many social, cultural and political connections. Being clustered together at the east end of the San Gabriel Valley we cross each others boundaries to shop, eat, recreate, work, join service and social clubs, and we frequently join together to tackle common problems. We are a true "area of common interest" in every sense of that phrase. It makes obvious sense that we should be grouped together in a single district when the new supervisor district boundaries are drawn. Also, since most of the communities have long been represented by Supervisor Knabe, and he and his staff and they are intimately familiar with our problems and issues, it makes a great deal of sense that these communities should be in District 4. Several of the redistricting plans that have been submitted would accomplish such an alignment.

For Rowland Heights, where (I/we) live, inclusion in District 4 is especially important. As an unincorporated area we are 100% dependent upon the County for our community services. Since we are not a city, we do not have local city officials to help us when there are problems. We depend upon the staff of the field office of Supervisor Knabe that is located in Rowland Heights to help us find solutions. Their help is invaluable. If we were to be placed in District 1 or 5, as some of the redistricting plans suggest, it would be a serious loss for our residents. The District 1 field office is in El Monte, at least 10 miles away and the District 5 field office is similarly inconveniently located. Please do not do that to us.

The Woodland Hills/Tarzana Chamber of Commerce urges you to preserve cohesive districts that keep communities of interest together. We would like the Southwest San Fernando Valley and more specifically the communities of Woodland Hills, West Hills, Canoga Park, Winnetka, Tarzana, Chatsworth, Reseda, Lake Balboa, Van Nuys and Encino to be viewed as a cohesive community because it:

Has a long history of fighting for recognition as a single community, including the effort on the part of the City of LA residents to secede from the City in 2002; and the recent formation of a Council of Governments or COG, representing local government jurisdictions Valley-wide

Is well recognized as a community of interest by business groups which have formed multiple valley-wide organizations (VICA, Economic Alliance of the San Fernando Valley, Valley Economic Development Council); by community and social service groups which routinely use the Valley to define themselves (such as the Valley Interfaith Council) and by the media which has also staked out the Valley as a service area (San Fernando Valley Business Journal, Daily News)

Has a unified interest in improving the transportation options that cross the Valley and link it to the Westside, including the Orange Line extension and the ongoing 405/101 freeway interchange improvements.
