I strongly support keeping Hacienda Heights as part of the Fourth Supervisorial District of Los Angeles County, in the final outcome of the redistricting process.

Our nation is experiencing a terrible economic downturn and Los Angeles County is no exception. Recovery from this downturn is not in the immediate future. Redistricting at this time is not fiscally sound. Consider all of the funds it will take to physically move facilities, signage and all kinds of changes.

The County is already complaining about shortage of funds. Services are being cut in various departments, personnel is being transferred around to try to keep things running efficiently and a variety of other things. We think redistricting would only compound an existing problem.

Therefore this committee should include fiscal responsibility in your consideration.

We do not want to see our neighborhoods, communities and cities divided into separate districts. The Fourth District boundaries, as currently drawn, should be maintained as much as possible. Split communities could result in changes to the service quality and timeliness we have come to expect from the County.
