SUBJECT: City of Santa Fe Springs/Supervisory District Maps

Dear Chairperson Pedersen:

The Santa Fe Springs City Council has asked me to write you on their behalf to express their position on the proposed redistricting maps for the County Supervisorial Districts. While the City of Santa Fe Springs has been more than adequately represented by 1<sup>st</sup> District Supervisor Gloria Molina over the past many years, the Council feels that the proposed maps that would move Santa Fe Springs into the 4<sup>th</sup> District would be beneficial to the community at-large. Although Santa Fe Springs shares many of the demographic characteristics of its neighboring Southeast Los Angeles County cities, it shares more in common with the cities of the 4<sup>th</sup> District. The engine that drives Santa Fe Springs is its robust commercial and industrial business base. Over the years, we have found ourselves more often collaborating on issues with the cities of La Mirada, Cerritos, Lakewood and Long Beach, for instance, more so than some of our northerly, San Gabriel Valley neighbors. Having the same County Supervisor would be helpful in terms of leveraging our collective influence.

Again, we are appreciative of our past relationship with the First District, but feel that moving to the 4<sup>th</sup> District would better represent our interests. Therefore, we are urging you to adopt district boundaries that would include Santa Fe Springs in the 4<sup>th</sup> District. Thank you for time and consideration.
