
As one of the original developers of Marina del Rey, I appreciate that our distinctive community has always been represented by the Fourth District at the Board of Supervisors.

An unincorporated area, Marina del Rey was developed as a unique public-private partnership on County-owned land. For the past five decades, Marina del Rey has always been effectively represented by the Fourth District County Supervisor. There is no reason that this representation should not continue after your committee has revised the boundary lines of districts to reflect population changes.

Our community in Marina del Rey will be best served by continuing to be included in the Fourth District, and hopefully the coastal cities to the south will also remain in this district. We have much in common with communities such as Playa del Rey, the LAX/Westchester area and the remaining South Bay cities and Long Beach, areas that similarly include marinas and marine-related businesses.
