I am Mayor of the City of Palos Verdes Estates, and a member of the City Council. I am aware my Council's input was not directly solicited, and in turn we have not held public meetings to obtain input from our community. As such, I can only speak for myself as Mayor.

I strongly suggest that The Board maintain the current district boundaries, to the extent possible. Our Supervisor, Don Knabe, and his staff are well aware of the issues faced by our City and others in the district, and have provided a high level of service to our community.

I have communicated previously to the Boundary Review Committee regarding the proposed plans that would move our City into one of two other districts, with no explanation how or why this would be in the best interests of our City.

I believe there is a great value in continuity; to wit, if it isn't broken, don't fix it. Our City should remain in the Fourth Supervisorial District.
