RE: **Consideration of Plan S2 – Community Empowerment Plan**

The following is a summary of Plan S2 – Community Empowerment Plan, as submitted by Supervisor Mark Ridley-Thomas.

1. **Plan Summary:** This plan¹ proposes to reassign 1,010 redistricting units ("RDUs") which make up 128 whole or partial communities. The moves of these areas are summarized on pages 3-5, and are further detailed on pages 10-21 of the *Report on Proposed Redistricting Plan – Plan S2*. The relevant summary pages (pages 3-5) are enclosed here as Attachment 1.

2. **Population Deviation:** The total population deviation in the proposed plan is 2.81 percent.

¹ This plan is an amended version of the original Plan S1 – LACBOS-African-American that was submitted to the Los Angeles County Supervisorial Boundary Review Committee ("BRC"). The original Plan S1 was submitted by Jackie Dupont-Walker, Tunua Thrash and Marqueece Harris-Dawson. Since Plan S1 did not use the County's Redistricting software or County's RDUs, the analysis of the original plan was performed by correlating census block information with the County's RDUs and thereafter approximating the available data. The analysis for all subsequent versions used the same underlying approximated data for the original plan. Plan S1 was thereafter amended by BRC Commissioner Vincent Harris during the BRC proceedings to make minor adjustments, including moving Wilmington from the Second District to the Third District. Supervisor Ridley-Thomas submitted Plan S1 as amended as his redistricting proposal on August 16, 2011, with the plan being renamed as Plan S2.

3. Number of People Moved: This plan reassigns 3,375,553 people among the five districts. The total population moved to and from each district is summarized on page 11 of the *Report on Proposed Redistricting Plan – Plan S2*. The relevant page is enclosed here as Attachment 2.

4. Deferred/Advanced Voting: County supervisors are elected to staggered four-year terms. The First and Third Districts elect supervisors at each general election at which the Governor is to be elected (i.e. 2010, 2014, 2018). The Second, Fourth and Fifth Districts elect supervisors at each election which the President appears on the ballot (i.e. 2008, 2012, 2016, etc.). Countywide, 22.7 percent of constituents in the County will be affected by deferral or advancement under this proposed plan. A table containing deferral and advancement information is enclosed here as Attachment 3 and is summarized below.

Advancement

Voters who will be reassigned from the First and Third Districts into the Second, Fourth or Fifth Districts, will have an opportunity to vote for a County supervisor twice in four (4) years (2010, 2012), thus advancing their right to vote for a supervisor.

In the Benchmark First District, 948,628 constituents will be reassigned to either the Second, Fourth or Fifth Districts. As a result of this proposed plan, 50.1 percent of all constituents, 54.5 percent of the citizen voting age population ("CVAP"), and 53.1 percent of registered voters in the Benchmark First District are advanced.

In the Benchmark Third District, 117,896 constituents will be reassigned to either the Second, Fourth or Fifth Districts. As a result of this proposed plan, 6.0 percent of all constituents, 5.5 percent of the CVAP, and 5.2 percent of registered voters in the Benchmark Third District are advanced.

Deferment

Voters who will be reassigned from the Second, Fourth and Fifth Districts into the First and Third Districts, will not have the opportunity to vote for a County supervisor until 2014. For those reassigned voters, six (6) years will have passed since they last had the opportunity to vote for a supervisor.

In the Benchmark Second District, 43,916 constituents will be reassigned to either the First or Third Districts. As a result of this proposed plan, 2.3 percent of all constituents, 2.9 percent of the CVAP, and 2.6 percent of registered voters in the Benchmark Second District are deferred.

In the Benchmark Fourth District, 977,736 constituents will be reassigned to either the First or Third Districts. As a result of this proposed plan, 50.9 percent of all constituents, 52.5 percent of the CVAP, and 53.6 percent of registered voters in the Benchmark Fourth District are deferred.

In the Benchmark Fifth District, 135,980 constituents will be reassigned to either the First or Third Districts. As a result of this proposed plan, 6.5 percent of all constituents, 6.8 percent of the CVAP, and 6.9 percent of registered voters in the Benchmark Fifth District are deferred.

5. Citizen Voting Age Population (CVAP): The CVAP information per district is summarized on page 35 of the *Report on Proposed Redistricting Plan – Plan S2*. The relevant page is enclosed here as Attachment 4.

6. Incumbency: This plan does not displace any supervisor from his/her district.

7. Contiguity/Compactness: All five supervisorial districts are contiguous and are reasonably compact.

The ACS is an ongoing statistical survey by the U.S. Census Bureau, sent to approximately 250,000 addresses monthly (or 3 million per year). ACS estimates are based on data collected from January 1, 2005 to December 31, 2009, and are not 2010 Census data. The percentages of the voting age citizen population by Race/Ethnicity from the ACS were applied to the 2010 Census counts of the voting age population at the census block level to obtain estimates of the voting age citizen population by Race/Ethnicity as of April 1, 2010.
2. The **Voting Age Citizen** column depicts each citizen, age 18 and older, being counted only once - even multi-race persons.
3. The Department of Justice defined a set of 8 exclusive race/ethnicity population categories; persons are counted once in their applicable DOJ category.
4. The **COUNT** columns contain voting age citizen population totals for each district, and for DOJ categories within each district.
