3. Overview and Discussion of the Citizens Redistricting Commission (CRC) including LA County demographics, applicants and application review options, and timeline to select the remaining six members. (20-6747)

Executive Director, Gayla Kraetsch Hartsough provided Commissioners with an overview of the actions they needed to take in December to select the remaining six CRC (Citizens Redistricting Commission)

Commissioners. As part of the presentation, they were given an overview of the 52 individuals remaining in the CRC applicant pool, along with an overview of the Los Angeles demographics.

Commissioner Holtzman shared a table he had prepared regarding Political Party Preference demographics.

Commissioners considered several options for evaluating the 52 individuals and agreed on:

- The goal is to have each CRC application reviewed by at least 2 Commissioners, resulting in an average of 12-13 CRC applications per person to be randomly assigned to them.
- Commissioners are welcome to evaluate more than the 12-13 CRC applicants assigned if they would like to.
- Commissioners adopted a holistic approach that integrates four criteria: analytical skills relevant to redistricting/voting rights, State and Federal legal requirements, impartiality, and appreciation of LA County's diverse demographics and geography.
- Commissioners will rate applicants on a 10-point scale, based on this holistic criterion, via an online survey tool. A section of the online tool provides space for Commissioners to add comments regarding the candidates they evaluated.
- The Commissioners agreed to complete the initial evaluations by Saturday, December 19, 5:00 p.m., for summarization in time for the next CRC meeting on Monday, December 21, 2020.
