As for the mountains..they have benefitted greatly from the contiguity under the Third District supervisor helping maintain a strong support constituency and allowing the Supervisor to help them prosper and thrive as one of the single most important assets Los Angeles offers its residents.

As for volunteerism, the communities of interest within the Third District have provided a viable and sensible base from which to design, conduct and implement the right volunteer opportunities for thousands of Angelenos to improve the quality of life. These borders facilitate this process as both the authorities and the population tend to cohere around certain issues and interests. Changing the boundaries could negatively impact much of the volunteer infrastructure we have created.
