Honorable Co-Chairs and Members of the Commission:

The City of Palmdale would like to go on record in support of a redistricting plan that keeps our North County Cities (cities of Palmdale, Lancaster, Santa Clarita, and surrounding unincorporated areas) together, in the same supervisory district. The North County was formed because our cities are geographically situated, which allows us to address shared concerns.

North County cities have prepared Hazard Mitigation Plans, Measure R and Measure M Highway Improvement Project Lists and the Measure H Homeless Initiative. The collaborative body throughout North County has worked together on housing, employment, transportation and numerous other plans and projects that benefit the residents, businesses and those traveling to and through the region. Most of these programs impact the region as a whole and are not specific to one community. In addition, all of these cities contract with Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department, Animal Control and Fire Department and work together on emergency preparedness and disaster response, which is of utmost importance due to the region's history of wildfires and flooding.

The cities serve as a collective body via the North County Transportation Coalition (NCTC) representing the North Los Angeles County subregion on the Regional Transportation Plan (RTP) / Sustainable Communities Strategy (SCS) and other regional transportation projects. In addition, the group is represented at Los Angeles Metro on the Metro Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) and Metro Streets and Freeways Subcommittee, to provide input on the Long-Range and Short-Range Transportation Plans, and other plans/projects that impact the region.


