"The Commissioners discussed if the "Clean Slate" should be labeled Option 1 or as Default. Commissioner Holtzman thought the public should only have the "Clean Slate" as an option, at startup of the mapping software, but have access to the existing district boundaries the same way as they have access to other political boundaries. He said the existing districts were drawn by supervisors and are often considered to "belong" to supervisors, so it is difficult to have a commission that is independent of the existing supervisors if the commission gives any special treatment to the existing district boundaries."


Commissioner Hailes Soto is the selected Leader of the Ad Hoc Working Group (WG) on Mapping. He provided an overview of the Ad Hoc WG meeting. The Ad Hoc WG reviewed COI maps that ARCBridge had developed, based on each Commissioner team's hypotheses. They discussed the importance of filling in areas where no public input was provided but were surrounded by communities that had provided input. They also wanted to present to the full commission a synthesized map of COI groupings for discussion the next day.

Commissioner Hailes Solo and Executive Director Gayla Kraetsch Hartsough met with Priti Mathur of ARCBridge the next morning to develop a synthesized map of COI groupings as a straw model. Priti Mathur presented the straw model.

The Commissioners asked questions about the COI groupings and agreed to submit suggested refinements to Gayla Kraetsch Hartsough by noon on Monday, October 18, 2021, for her to review with the Ad Hoc WG on Mapping later that day. ARCBridge and the Ad Hoc WG will return will another set of COI groupings.

Commissioner Holtzman suggested that the name "COI Groupings" be considered for the COI Straw Model, as the model shows map areas that are in many cases larger than the COI hypotheses we had discussed at our last meeting and/or reflect a combination of such COI hypotheses.



Commissioner Brian Stecher emphasized that the Commission should use the COI groupings for references points and not become absorbed in over-analyzing them, given the next phase of focus will be on reviewing the public-submitted maps of the supervisorial districts.

<u>6b. Review and Discussion of publicly submitted maps and possible direction to ARCBridge about future map considerations — Co-Chairs Dan Mayeda and Carolyn Williams</u>

i. Presentation by ARCBridge

Priti Mathur of ARCBridge presented an overview of the four maps of 5 supervisorial districts submitted to date. Commissioners asked questions of clarification. Thai Le showed the Commissioners and the public where the maps are housed on the hub on the LA County CRC website: https://redistricting-lacounty.hub.arcgis.com/

The Commissioners focused on how useful the maps were and requested Priti Mathur to work with Los Angeles County ISD and Esri to provide more details through shape files that could be shared with everyone.

The Commissioners also discussed the timing for posting Commissioner-prepared maps options. A motion was made to postpone posting Commissioner-prepared maps until October 25, 2021, so that the public has had an opportunity to submit maps without undue influence by the Commission and avoid public perception that the Commission has already made up its mind on a map. The Commissioner-prepared maps would be available prior to the Commission's selection of map options for public hearings. The motion passed.


