6.a.ii.e. (COI Hypotheses – North Country: Antelope Valley and Santa Clarita Valley)	Jacqueline Ayer	Other	Redistricting in the County of Los Angeles was a key topic of discussion at the September 29 meeting of the Association of Rural Town Councils. A particular concern that was raised by member councils was that, under the current district configuration, all high desert communities are located in one supervisory district (the 5th District) which itself spans more than half of the entire County; the other four supervisory districts are much smaller in size and encompass predominantly urban and suburban areas. As a result, four of the five County Supervisors have no understanding of the circumstances and challenges faced by high desert communities in general, and rural communities in particular. It was pointed out that, when the 5th District Supervisor presents the board with issues that are of critical importance to high desert rural communities, these issues are often downplayed and even dismissed as trivial or irrelevant by the other four Supervisors. In other words, it is a constant struggle for the 5th District Supervisor to advance the interests of high desert rural communities. It became clear in the discussion that several rural representatives are frustrated with the current Supervisory District configuration	10/06/21	See Attachment
