AGENDA ITEM 6: ACTION/DISCUSSION ITEMS

6a. Discussion and Potential Approval of Final Map – Co-Chairs Carolyn Williams and Dan Mayeda

There was no staff report on Map F-4. Thai V. Le, Clerk, displayed Map F-4 with the timer on the screen to take public comment. Map F-4 was displayed on the LA County CRC website: <https://redistricting.lacounty.gov/>. It can also be found on the redistricting hub: (<https://redistricting-lacounty.hub.arcgis.com/>)

Public Comments

Public comment – see recordings on “VIDEO FILE FOR ENTIRE MEETING POSTED” at the start of the minutes: Co-Chair Dan Mayeda set a time limit on public comment of 30 minutes. There were 22 individuals who signed up to make public comment, who did not have the opportunity to make public comments.

1. Bryan Cook, City Manager, Temple City – liked Temple City being in SD 5 for continuity
2. Isabel Gonzalez – recommended modifications to the map to achieve improvements; Commerce and the eastern SGV are COIs; they buy and shop in the shared communities; the COIs want to stay together in SD 1
3. Henry Perez – East LA resident in SD 1; recommended modifications to keep Commerce and Montebello in SD 1 because they share similar geography and relationships





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4. Stacey Armato, Hermosa Beach City Councilmember – wanted beach communities with Torrance and Palos Verdes Peninsula versus DTLA; wanted to keep Lynwood and Florence-Firestone in SD 2 so the beach communities could be in SD 4
5. Carlos Leon – said Map F4 promoted equity
6. John Leonard, City of Hollywood – wanted to stay in SD 3 as is the case with Map F-4
7. Faraz Aqil – Downey resident; wanted to keep SELA together; did not want to move Lincoln Park and Lynwood; wanted to move Torrance into SD 2 to keep the beach cities together
8. Ruby Rivera, InnerCity Struggle – stated Lynwood should be part of SELA
9. Sonja Diaz, former LACCRC Commissioner – wanted SD 1 and SD 4 not to fall below 50% Latino
10. Derek Steele – wanted to remove wetlands and bring in COIs more aligned with SD 2; wanted to preserve South Central LA communities
11. Chris Rowe – submitted written comments; wanted northern area of SFV to be included in SD 3 versus Sylmar
12. Abbe Land, West Hollywood resident – liked West Hollywood in SD 3 as it is in Map F-4
13. Heath Kline, Woodland Hills Neighborhood Council – echoed Chris Rowe; wanted to reunite northern SFV in SD 3 and have SD 5 include the northeastern portion of SFV that had similar environmental concerns
14. Marcia Hanscom, Defend Ballona Wetlands – wanted to alter Map F-4 and take Washington Blvd. to the ocean to keep the watershed together and include the entire wetlands; would prefer to be in SD 4
15. Pamela Agustin – SD 1 community organization; wanted modifications to Map F-4 to keep SELA whole and Commerce and Montebello in SD 1
16. Wayne Craig, President of Rescue Our Waterfront in Redondo Beach – described “fatal flaw” for Redondo Beach and Hermosa Beach in SD 2; wanted to put Lynwood and Florence-Firestone back to SD 2
17. David Wilson, City of West Hollywood – described an earlier letter to be in SD 3 with Beverly Hills and the Westside Cities COG; shared concerns about homelessness and related issues
18. Lee Coller, Redondo Beach resident – wanted beach cities with Palos Verdes Peninsula and Torrance
19. Emma Dodson, Trees of the Marina – SD 3 resident; Map F-4 split the ecological reserve between two SDs; needed overall oversight of the wetlands with one Supervisor
20. Sepi Shyne, City of West Hollywood, Mayor Pro Tem – wanted to keep West Hollywood in SD 3
21. Jessica Panduro – wanted to bring other communities into SD 2 and to keep SELA whole
22. Jacquelyn Dupont-Walker, AME Church of Southern California – supported Map F-4 that preserved COIs; spiritual lifestyles and equity maintained
23. Assata Umoja, Hyde Park Organizational Partnership for Empowerment – wanted to be sure the African American population have a voting voice





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24. Hildy Stern, Mayor, Manhattan Beach – concerned about removing the beaches from SD 4

Commissioner discussions – see recordings on “VIDEO FILE FOR ENTIRE MEETING POSTED” at the start of the minutes:

Co-Chair Mayeda emphasized the hard work of the Commissioners to ensure the diverse population of Los Angeles County had access to the public hearings and meetings, including hybrid meetings on site in each of the five supervisorial districts. He encouraged the Commissioners to consider all of the public comments provided throughout the year. He asked the Commissioners for any proposals on modifications to Map F-4.

Motion 1: Entertainment District and Other Changes (Approved)

Commissioner David Holtzman requested Thai V. Le, GIS/Technical Expert, to place an overlay of a map shape file he had developed. Based on Commissioner Holtzman’s guidance, Thai V. Le made the following changes:

- Moved the N2 corner of the SFV (Granada Hills Porter Ranch, Chatsworth, and specific RDUs) to SD 3
- Moved Azusa and Citrus from SD 5 to SD 1
- Moved the Hollywood-Burbank Airport to SD 5
- Build an entertainment corridor in SD 5 by including portions of North Hollywood and Valley Village; Universal City; and a portion of Studio City in SD 5, not SD 3
- Moved a RDU in NE Sherman Oaks from SD 3 to SD 5

Commissioner Holtzman made a motion to make these changes. Commissioner Stecher seconded the motion. Commissioners asked questions of clarification. The motion passed with the understanding that these changes might be further changed in future motions to be made later that day.

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Motion 2: Beach Cities in SD 4 (Failed)

Commissioner Brian Stecher proposed the following changes so that Thai V. Le could show them on Map F-4:

- Moved Redondo Beach, Hermosa Beach, and Manhattan Beach to SD 4
- Moved Florence-Firestone and Walnut Park to SD 2 (but not Lynwood)
- Consolidated Pico Union Neighborhood Council to make it whole, including a section below Route 10, in SD 2

The Commissioners asked questions of clarification. It was noted that these changes brought the map out of compliance with the population deviation limitations and that, if the Commission wanted to make the changes, additional modifications would need to be made to bring the overall map into compliance. In response, Commissioner Brian Stecher proposed the following additional amendments:

- Undo the change with Azusa and Citrus in Motion 1 so they are in SD 1
- Move all of the Ballona Wetlands (Washington Blvd., just above Marina Del Rey) so they are all in SD 2

Commissioner Brian Stecher clarified his motion to involve the changes to move the three beach communities (Redondo Beach, Hermosa Beach, and Manhattan Beach) to SD 4, move Florence-Firestone and Walnut Park to SD 2, move the Pico Union wedge (area along Route 10) to SD 2, consolidate the Ballona wetlands (south of Washington Blvd. and Venice) into SD 2, and put Azusa and Citrus back into SD 1 from SD 2. The result of all of these changes would bring the map into compliance with the population deviation limitations.

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Motion 3: Multiple Changes (Failed)

Commissioner Doreena Wong requested Thai V. Le to overlay her Map OP 112 on Map F-4; she walked through the following modifications with the Commissioners:

- Moved Koreatown and Little Bangladesh into SD 1
- Kept Thai Town in SD 1
- Moved Torrance to SD 2
- Moved Lomita to SD 2
- Moved Ballona Wetlands to SD 2
- Kept West Hills and NW corner of SFV in SD 3 (consistent with Commissioner Stecher’s Motion 1)
- Put all of Sun Valley in SD 5
- Moved Pico Rivera to SD 4

The Commissioners discussed these modifications. Commissioner Doreena Wong made a motion, which was seconded. The motion failed.

Motion 4: Ballona Wetlands in SD 3 (Failed)

Commissioner Mary Kenney proposed moving all Ballona Wetlands (south of Washington Blvd.) into SD 3 to balance the population. She accepted Commissioners Saira Soto’s amendment to add Venice. The motion was seconded. The Commissioners discussed the Ballona Wetlands motion. The motion failed.

AGENDA ITEM 7: EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT – Gayla Kraetsch Hartsough, Ph.D.
