The proposed map that the commission worked on cut out Carson from District 2, which is a majority minority community with Blacks representing 23% of the population. It was most helpful though that working map drafts were available early, while this County effort didn't seem to include early iterations, steering rather to mapping software.</p> <p>Besides my and my wife's families' history, ranging from parts of District 3 from East Hollywood to Van Nuys, but also to San Gabriel Valley communities, I lived in and/or worked in Agoura for over 40 years. I was involved in the Chamber of Commerce and several City of Agoura Hills (Parks &amp; Rec, Community Services, Open Space Conservation Task Force) until moving near my grandparent's humble old flat below the Silverlake, and then to Winnetka, so my wife's drive to her teaching job at San Fernando High wouldn't be longer.</p> <p>I remember well when District 3 was drastically changed as part of improving representation in the eastern areas of the county, in the wake of a lawsuit. It is very important to our programs and young constituents to keep this region whole particularly the City of Carson and its assets CSU Dominguez Hills. Youth in a housing and economic crisis benefit from SOH resources and deserve not to have their power and representation split or removed as we are an important community of interest. It is for this reason, I strongly urge you (Commissioners) to decline Map B1 and B2 because of it dilutes the voice of a strong Black community and disrupts critical crisis service delivery to youth and young adult constituents in Carson; accept Map F1 because it keeps historical communities of South LA together and provides a voice and strong representation for Black residents and stakeholders; and accept Map G with modifications of keeping the City of Carson in District 2. Do not separate CSU Dominguez Hills from District 2 due to its connection and recruitment from South LA, Compton, and other communities in District 2 (I have students from my program attending there); Carson has historically been connected to South LA and Gardena as recognized Black communities. I have been touched by their concerns. I believe you can address the majority of those concerns without adversely impacting the needs of those of us who live in the heart of District 3. While many of our County's communities of interest are based on shared ethnic and cultural heritage, other communities are not. Those of us who live in and around the environmentally sensitive and fire-prone southwest portion of the county are defined far more by environment and geography than demography. While cultural and ethnic characteristics are transient and may see their boundaries shift over time, shared environmental and geographical boundaries do not. This fact impacts everything else in our vicinity — city boundaries, economic interests and more. Our own COG is formed on this basis.</p> <p>I recently called attention to the Southern California Edison PSPS (Public Safety Power Shutdown) which took place on Thanksgiving and Black Friday throughout the high fire risk areas of Southern California. This decision impacted over 57,000 SCE customers, including 15,000 in Los Angeles County, virtually all of them residents of District 3. It is also noteworthy that the footprint of 2018's Woolsey Fire (from which we are still recovering three years later) was also entirely within District 3. If these boundaries were</p>		
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		<p>substantially revised to incorporate the coastal communities of the South Bay and Palos Verdes — as proposed in Map F — it would constitute a district so large, so geographically disparate as to be unmanageable, increasing the likelihood of more costly disasters and making them harder to address in an efficient and expeditious manner. You would also be merging rural coastal communities with cosmopolitan coastal communities whose economies and environmental challenges are radically different.</p> <p>Just on the matter of fire safety alone, I would call your attention to <a href="#">this tool</a> which allows you to see the historic footprint of brushfires in Southern California. I've attached a graphic showing the aggregated footprint of all fires in the region since 1980. You will note in particular how concentrated the fire burden is in District 3. That burden has extended beyond fire season into winter floods, landslides and, more recently, power shutoffs. I have also attached a graphic from SCE's own app on Thanksgiving displaying the areas subject to power shutoff. You will again note that the area of concern lies entirely within District 3. Both of these maps also show a clear demarcation between our county's fire-and-disaster ravaged rural coastal communities and those which have never been ravaged by disaster. Map B and only Map B recognizes that delineation. It is a sensible and practical delineation which makes for good public policy and wise allocation and management of resources.</p> <p>Whatever else you do with inland communities, I would implore you to do everything in your power to preserve the Map B boundaries for District 3.
